

Moses Called to Deliver Israel

Scripture Lesson is Exodus 3:1-14. **This is an excerpt from the message.**

God gave him a needful caution against rashness and irreverence in his approach. He must keep his distance, draw near, but not too near. Near enough to hear but not pry. Put off thy shoes what then what putting off the hat is now, a token of respect and submission.

We ought to approach God by a grave and reverent behavior in the worship of God and avoid everything that is rude and unbecoming of the service.

Ver 6: Moreover he said, I am the God of thy father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God.

God let him know who speaks to him, He declares his solemn authority, I am the God of thy father. By this God intends to instruct Moses in the knowledge of another world and to strengthen his belief of a future state, To assure Moses of the fulfillment of all the promises made to the fathers. "He remembered his covenant". Heb.11:13 & 37 These all died in faith, not having receive the promises but having seen them afar off, ... And these all, have received witness through faith, received not the promise.

Matt 22: 32 I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? God is not the God of the dead, but of the living. Abraham had made his transition, yet God maintains his covenant relationship with him. Heb. 11; 13-16 They were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. Desiring a better country, that is, an heavenly ... for he hath prepared for them a city.

When God calls us into His service, He enables us for our work, and promises us His presence.
